



Introducing: Advances in Brief

The *Journal of Histochemistry & Cytochemistry* is pleased to introduce a new section, **Advances in Brief**. The goal of this new section is to provide a venue for authors who wish to publish a shorter manuscript that reports important scientific findings but is short of the penultimate studies reviewers routinely expect of full articles. Advances in Brief will follow the same structure as full-length articles, but will be limited to a manuscript length of 2000 words,

two pages of figures, and two tables. Editors and reviewers will be made aware of the article category of submission during review. Manuscripts will be subject to the same level of rigor with reference to validation and reproducibility. It is anticipated that this will allow authors greater flexibility to publish studies with important findings that advance science without the expectation of hypothesis-defined studies.
